Monotheism: Making Connections Between the Three Abrahamic Religions

Overview:

In this lesson, students will collaborate in small groups to research one of the 3 Abrahamic religions, Judaism, Christianity, or Islam. Students will analyze primary and secondary sources to gather information on the origins, basic beliefs and practices, prophets, religious symbols, etc. of one Abrahamic religion. Students will then individually create a one page mini-poster to display the information they have learned. Then, students will explore the other two Abrahamic religions by completing a Gallery Walk where they travel around the room, analyzing the information organized by their classmates, and recording it on a graphic organizer. Lastly, students will compare and contrast the three religions, making connections to historical significance and modern life.

Objectives:

Students will be able to:

- 1. Use primary and secondary sources to research one Abrahamic religion (Judaism, Christianity, or Islam).
- 2. Identify key elements of one Abrahamic religion such as its origins, basic beliefs and practices, prophets, religions symbols, etc.
- Create a mini-poster based on their research of one Abrahamic religion. 4.
 Interpret and record information on the remaining Abrahamic religions provided by their classmates.
- 4. Compare and contrast the three Abrahamic religions using a venn diagram.

Recommended Grade Level(s): 6th-7th grade

Time Required:

4 class periods, approximately 55 minutes each.

Activities (described as steps)

- Students will either receive one Abrahamic religion to research using text-based information and/or video. They will use this research to identify and describe the origins, deity, founder. Prophets, basic beliefs, etc. of their assigned religion on the Abrahamic Religions Graphic Organizer.
- 2. Students will then complete a one page poster demonstrating their understanding of their Abrahamic religion.
- 3. After, students' projects will be displayed in the classroom for others to view. We will

then complete a gallery walk where students go from project to project, gathering information about the two Abrahamic religions they did not research.

- 4. Next, students will visit the posters made by their group mates to see the consistency between information shared by each classmate.
- 5. After gathering information on all of the 3 Abrahamic religions, the students will return to their seats and will discuss the following questions with their table partner: What were 2 similarities you noticed about the two religions you researched today compared to the religion you researched earlier? What were 2 differences you noticed between the religion you researched earlier and the two religions you researched today?
- 6. Then, the teacher will hand out the Abrahamic Religions Venn Diagram and have students compare and contrast all 3 Abrahamic religions with a partner. Remind students to use as many examples as possible when noting the similarities and differences among all 3 religions.
- Next, the class will go over their Venn Diagrams and combine/condense ideas to show how similar the three Abrahamic religions are and discuss their links and evolution over time.

Evaluation:

Brief writing assignment: Compare and Contrast the three Abrahamic religions, including at least 2 similarities and 2 differences.

Extension Activities:

- Students could continue to research and explore the prevalence of one or all of these religions today and how they have changed over time.
- Students could share their findings in the form of a research paper, slideshow presentation, or physical project.

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Abrahamic Religions One-Pager

Abrahamic religions share many common themes. They began and spread rapidly throughout the world during the Age of Empires. Their rapid spread was largely due to trade routes and maritime routes (trade by the sea). Many of these religions still have a profound influence on the world and its people today.
